[Present at Baker Act Cases](#)

The Supreme Court of Florida has ordered that Lee County judges need to be physically present at Baker Act cases. Judges had been conducting Baker Act hearings over video to save time and money. Telecommuting for these hearings has had negative effects on persons with mental health disabilities at these cases. Some of the clients have issues distinguishing what is real and what is not real, and find hearings held in this fashion disturbing. In order for persons with mental health disabilities to have due process under the law, the judges have been ordered to stop telecommuting for Baker Act hearings.
